South Coast Best Winery in State Two Years in a Row For the second year in a row, a winery from the Temecula Valley was judged the best in the state at the California State Fair. South Coast Winery, which opened its doors just six years ago, again won the fair's Golden Bear Winery trophy, which goes to the winery that wins the most medals and awards at the prestigious wine competition. South Coast beat out more than 600 other wineries to capture the trophy, which in the past has gone to such well-known wineries as Kendall-Jackson and Geyser Peak. "With this back-to-back win, South Coast Winery continues to demonstrate to the world that Southern California's Temecula Valley is a quality, awardwinning wine region," states Jim Carter, owner/vintner of South Coast Winery Resort & Spa. "While I am personally pleased with our performance, this win is not just for South Coast Winery. We are proud to share this prestigious accomplishment and the attention with the entire region." Other Temecula Valley wineries that won gold medals and best of class awards at the California State Fair included Wiens Family Cellars, Maurice Car'rie Vineyard and Winery and Falkner Winery. Altogether, Temecula Valley wineries brought home 7 golds, 29 silver and 15 bronze medals from the state fair. Despite the recognition, Carter finds it ironic that wine maps of California in Wine Spectator stop at Santa Barbara and fail to include Temecula and the rest of Southern California, which is home to more than 100 wineries. "I think this clearly shows all of California

that wines from the Temecula Valley are at least equal to those from the rest of California," Carter said.

Robert Renzoni Vineyards & Winery, a family-run winery that celebrated its first anniversary in April, has joined the Temecula Valley Winegrowers Association. Although the winery opened its tasting room in the spring of 2008, its family owners are part of a winemaking tradition that goes back more than 100 years. Its wines can be found in nearly three-dozen restaurants from Oceanside to Lake Elsinore. In the coming year the winery plans to introduce several new wines made from Mediterranean varietals. The 12-acre estate currently includes a 4,000-square-foot tasting room/production facility and about 9 acres of vineyard planted with the premiere Brunello clone of Sangiovese, Pinot Grigio and Cabernet Sauvignon. In addition the winery offers a rose' of Sangiovese, Old Vine Zinfandel, Concerto ( a blend of Zinfandel, Syrah and Merlot), Moscato, Bellisimo (Italian style Riesling) as well as oaked and non-oaked Chardonnay. Robert Renzoni Vineyards & Winery tasting room is located at 37350 De Portola Road and is open daily from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Entries are starting to trickle in for the Temecula Valley Wine Society's 5th Annual Southern California Wine Country Wine Competition, which has been opened up this year to the 100 or so wineries from Malibu to the Mexican border that make up the South Coast winegrowing region. The Temecula Valley Winegrowers Association also is partnering with the Wine Society to put on the event. Judging will take place on July 28-29 by a panel that includes Bob Foster, Jeff Slankard, wine director for Barron's, Dan Berger, wine writer, and Stacie Hunt, sommelier and host of a radio food show on KCRW-FM in Santa Monica. Winners will be announced at a gala dinner at Wiens Family Cellars on July 29 at 6 p.m. that will be catered by The Forge. Cost of the dinner is \$55. Proceeds benefit the Wine Society's scholarship fund. For
